Where the boundary lines show bearings, lengths or locations which vary from those recorded in deeds, abutting plats, or other instruments there shall be the following note placed along such lines, "recorded as (show recorded bearing, length or location)";
- (d) The map shall show and describe all monuments necessary for the location of the parcel and shall indicate whether such monuments were found or piaced;
- (e) The map shall identify the person for whom the survey was made, the date of the survey, and shall describe the parcel as provided in (4), above:
- (f) The map shall bear the stamp or seal and signature of the land surveyor under whose direction and control the survey was made with a statement certifying that the survey is correct to the best of his knowledge and belief.
- (6) Measurements. (a) Measurements shall be made with instruments and methods capable of attaining the required accuracy for the matticular problem involved.
- (b) The minimum accuracy of linear measurements between points shall be 1 part in 3,000 on all property lines of boundary or interior survey.
- (c) In a closed traverse the sum of the measured angles shall agree with the theoretical sum by a difference not greater than 30 seconds per angle, or the sum of the total angles shall not differ from the theoretical sum by more than 120 seconds, whichever is smaller.
- (d) Any closed traverse depicted on a property survey map shall have a latitude and departure closure ratio of less than 1 in 3,000.
- (e) Bearings or angles on any property survey map shall be shown to the nearest minute; distances shall be shown to the nearest 1/100th foot.
- (7) MONUMENTS. The type and position of monuments to be set on any survey shall be determined by the nature of the survey, the permanency required, the nature of the terrain, the cadastral features involved, and the availability of material.

# MINIMUM STANDARDS FOR PROPERTY SURVEYS

A-E 5.01 Minimum standards for proparty surveys

- A-E 5.01 Minimum standards for property surveys. (1) Score. The minimum standards of this section apply to every property survey performed in this state except that.
- (a) Where other standards for property surveys are prescribed by statute, administrative rule or ordinance, then such standards shall govern; and
- (b) The land surveyor and his or her client or employer may agree in a signed statement to exclude any land surveying work from the requirements of this section except the preparation of a U.S. Public Land Survey Monument Record, providing any map prepared by the land surveyor for the client or employer includes a note which states that an agreement to exclude work from the requirements of this section has been made, the names of the parties making the agreement and a description in plain language of the requirements not complied with.
- (2) PROPERTY SURVEY, DEFINITION. In this section, "property survey" means any land surveying which includes as one of its principal purposes describing, monumenting, locating the boundary lines of or mapping one or more parcels of land. The term includes the restoration, perpetuation or reestablishment of a U.S. public survey corner.
